Former Van Vleck student writes 1st book

Jim Ed Hardaway, a former resident of Matagorda County and a past student at Van Vleck, is the proud author of his first book, *It Was That Dang Red-Headed Preacher's Kid – Episodes from My Whimsical Childhood.*

The book contains 25 entertaining chapters of memoirs from Hardaway's childhood.

The book spans Jim Ed's grade school through early high school years, and includes hilarious tales of growing up a preacher's son in Matagorda County during the 80s.

Jim Ed's father, Pastor Jim Hardaway, pastored a few churches in the area, including First Baptist Church of Van Vleck, Cedar Lane Baptist Church and Harvest Time Church.

The memoirs focus on his time spent living in the area and his adventures while attending Van Vleck.

From the hysterical *Valley Girl Talk* and *Sunday School Prostitutes*, to the heart-warming *The Preacher*, to the quirky *Beetle Mischief*, to the highly motivating *Born to Rerun*, the book is a mixtape of laughs, inspiration, and nostalgia.

We had a chance to visit with Hardaway about his first book....

What gave you the idea to write a book?

I love to write, tell stories, and make people smile. Having a great memory of some funny and inspirational stories

from my childhood, it was only natural for me—as a creative vent—to put them on paper for others to enjoy. The stories were too entertaining not to tell.

Tell us a little about growing up. Where, when, etc (where you lived, when you went to Van Vleck, when you graduated)

As it begins in the prelude of the book: "My childhood was whimsical..." I grew up in several small towns in the South Texas area, but most of my childhood years were spent in Matagorda County.

Bay City and Van Vleck are two of the most prominent story settings in the book.

The latter was the most memorable. I went to Van Vleck schools from kindergarten through second grade, all my junior-high years sixth through eighth, and my freshman year in high-school. I graduated in 1989.

How long did it take you to write the book? How did the process go in getting it published?

I began writing the episodes, in random order, starting in March 2009 with the waggish kindergarten story *The Pledge of Allegiance Dare Master.*

During that time I was having a few meetings with a writing coach who inspired me as a story-teller, giving some fuel to the myriad of thoughts that were already stirring around inside my head for multiple book ideas.

When it came time to put *Dang Preacher's Kid* together in 2015, I already had completed about 18 of the 25 episodes.

I started handing off chapters to my editor a few at a time, while I got busy writing the rest of the book. There were a couple of other trusted friends I got involved regarding the marketing blurb, design, etc.

It was a dream come true, and kind of surreal, holding the first print copy of the book in my hands, smelling the paper, and flipping through the pages.

Tell us a little about some of the stories in the book (old friends, school, church?)

It Was That Dang Red-Headed Preacher's Kid • Episodes from My Whimsical Childhood is a collection of memoirs from my childhood—twentyfive entertaining chapters about growing up as a preacher's kid in the peculiar culture that is South Texas.

What could be funnier than the stories of preacher's kid navigating the volatile waters of life, while learning to walk the "narrow way?"

Especially when it started with his parents dressing him up in a devil costume on Halloween when he was just 3-

years-old! Yes, that's me in said costume on the cover.

The book is packed full of comical adventures with friends and engaging experiences at church and school.

It spans my grade school through early high school years, and is a cleverly written string of essays that takes the reader on an addicting page-flipping adventure through the never-disappointing 70s and 80s.

What age group does this book relate to?

There's something in the book for all ages. The book is a comical tale of mischief and misdemeanors —packed full of curiosity, pop culture, tribute, and surprises.

From the hysterical *Valley Girl Talk* and *Sunday School Prostitutes*, to the heart-warming *The Preacher*; to the quirky *Beetle Mischief*, to the highly motivating *Born To Rerun*, the book is a mixtape of laughs, inspiration, and nostalgia. It's my hope that readers rediscover their own childhood adventures and are inspired to imagine again.

What are your future plans for promoting the book?

I am doing some "Born To Rerun" (inspired by the final chapter of the book) speaking dates starting this summer and headed to the Bay City area in July to promote the book as well.
